At the Day of Review:

No appointment is necessary.

Staff members will be available to assist individuals and make revisions as necessary.

The computation of costs for the drain will be available.

Persons with disabilities needing accommodations for effective participation in the Day of Review should contact the Drain Commissioner's Office at the number noted above (voice) or through the Michigan Relay Center at 7-1-1 (TDD) at least 24 hours in advance of the Day of Review to request mobility, visual, hearing or other assistance.

or comments may be submitted in writing or verbally at the day of review. Comments submitted in advance must be received by the Drain Commissioner prior to the day of review to ensure consideration.

Assessments & Appeal:

Drain assessments are collected in the same manner as property taxes and will appear on your winter tax bill. If drain assessments are being collected for more than one (1) year, you may pay the assessment in full with any interest to date at any time and avoid further interest charges.

You may appeal the Drain Commissioner's determination of apportionments to the Arenac County Probate Court within ten (10) days after the day of review.
